WSIS+20 Informal Multistakeholder Sounding Board (IMSB)

Informal stakeholder mechanism for the WSIS+20 Review by the UN General Assembly

Purpose

The WSIS+20 Informal Multistakeholder Sounding Board will act as an informal body that serves as a channel to bring in perspectives, priorities, and expert insights from diverse non-governmental stakeholder communities, helping to ensure the review process remains transparent, inclusive, and responsive to broader public interest concerns.

Role and Functions

- Assist the Co-Facilitators informally by offering stakeholder-informed perspectives on key issues under negotiation, based on consolidated feedback from civil society, technical communities, academia, the private sector, youth, and other relevant non-governmental actors.
- Synthesize contributions from multistakeholder consultations into actionable advice, reflections, and written notes.
- Promote inclusivity by ensuring dialogue across regions, sectors, and traditionally underrepresented voices, with particular emphasis on the participation of women and girls, especially from the developing countries.

Guiding Principles

The IMSB will operate in accordance with the following principles:

- Independence Only individuals with no current affiliation to any government, intergovernmental organization, or diplomatic mission may participate.
- Legitimacy and Continuity Members will be drawn from the non-governmental members of the IGF MAG and LP, building on their bottom-up selection and prior engagement in global digital governance.
- Balance and Diversity The IMSB must reflect diversity across regions, with a strong commitment to gender balance, language, stakeholder groups, and the meaningful inclusion of marginalized and underrepresented communities,.
- Transparency and Openness Advice and inputs will be evidence-based, clearly documented, and shared in a spirit of openness and learning.
- Informality and Political Sensitivity The IMSB is an informal guidance body; members must respect the sensitivities of the intergovernmental process and refrain from actions that may be perceived as lobbying or negotiating.

Composition and Participation

- Membership is open to all non-governmental members of the 2025 IGF MAG and IGF Leadership Panel, serving in their personal capacity.
- All eligible individuals will be invited to volunteer for participation in the IMSB.
- If the number of volunteers exceeds a manageable size, selection criteria (e.g., balance across stakeholder groups and regions) will be applied.
- The group is expected to consist of 10 individuals, with flexibility based on volunteer interest.
- Two Co-Convenors will be elected by IMSB members from within the group to facilitate internal coordination and engagement with the Co-Facilitators.
- Efforts will be made to ensure gender parity in the final composition of the group, recognizing the importance of inclusive and gender-responsive multistakeholder processes.
- Efforts must be made to ensure geographical representation in the final composition of the group.

Working Modalities

- The IMSB will convene virtually on a regular basis from July to December 2025, with meeting frequency determined by milestones in the WSIS+20 process.
- Outputs may include short notes, consolidated stakeholder inputs, and high-level reflections aligned with the Co-Facilitators' requests.
- The IMSB will function strictly as an informal and non-negotiating group.
- Its role complements—but does not replace—broader stakeholder consultation mechanisms and concludes ahead of the WSIS+20 High-Level Meeting in December 2025.
