Dr. Daniela Barba, Director of Research on Access to Justice, World Justice Project

Daniela Barba is the Director of Research in Access to Justice at the World Justice Project. Since joining in July 2022, she has led and engaged in research on disparities in access to justice and the political economy of justice reform, utilizing both quantitative and qualitative methods. Daniela led the conceptual development of the WJP Justice Data Graphical Reports I and II, which provide crucial insights into global justice metrics. Her current efforts focus on developing justice

measurement tools and indicators for decision-makers through collaborations with the World Bank, the Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, and the Dominican Republic's Judiciary.

Daniela holds a Ph.D. and an M.A. in Politics and Social Policy from Princeton University, an M.A. in Comparative Politics from New York University, and a B.A. in International Relations from El Colegio de México. Previously, she was a Postdoctoral Researcher at Vanderbilt University's LAPOP Lab. Her research interests include access to justice, human rights accountability, criminal violence, and gender-based violence. Earlier in her career, Daniela worked for the Mexican government and nonprofits in Mexico and the U.S., evaluating supreme audit institutions in performance-oriented policy, assessing organizations serving at-risk children, and implementing a civic education program for marginalized communities.
