
Developed by APRM and Group of Experts to advance UN-CEPA Principles of Effective Governance across Africa.







- Case of Zambia: The theme for the eighth NDP is Socioeconomic transformation for Improved livelihoods. The strategic interventions are espoused in Four strategic Development Areas as follows: Economic Transformation and Job Creation agenda is the focus for the 8NDP to achieve: a stable macroeconomic environment; and deliver sustainable development for enhanced livelihoods for every Zambian.
- Key Sectors Mining, Agriculture, Tourism and Manufacturing Supported by strategic interventions in energy, transport and logistics, technology and science, infrastructure, skills and water development Other Strategic Development.
- Areas to support the economic transformation agenda for job creation are: Human and Social Development provision of basic services (water, health, education, social protection, etc) and creation of an effectively equipped human capital reserve to support economic transformation and job creation Environmental Sustainability mainstreaming of green interventions i.e. climate change adaptation"


Political power vs independence






