□ Advocacy:

- Strengthen the role of the Committee
- Establish the date for the UN Public Service Day
- Comprehensive process for the Public Service Awards
- Focus themes of forthcoming conferences in implementation of MDGs (Review topics)

□ Develop Analytical and Policy Tools:

- World Public Sector Report (future issues)
- Publication on Reinventing Government
- Build-up of the Basic Data of the Public Sector (see E/C.16/2002/2)
- Prepare analytical papers and publications (suggestions for topics)



WHAT WE PROPOSE TO DO

□ Build A Common Understanding:

- Expand the Charter of Public Service to other regions
- Offer permanent substantive support to the Global Forum

□ Provide Technical Assistance in Building Technological Adequacy and Connectivity in:

- Establishing an information technology framework responsive to local needs
- Creating an enabling environment for all stakeholders to benefit from knowledge, innovation and technology
- Developing e-government strategies, policies and activities
- Building partnerships at all levels to benefit from the up-to-date ICTs



WHAT WE PROPOSE TO DO

□ Provide Assistance in Institution-Building, namely in:

- Strengthening parliamentary and electoral systems and processes
- Reinforcing administration of justice at national and local levels
- Modernizing the public sector and improving public service delivery
- Reinforcing decentralization and local governments' institutional capacities
- Strengthening institutions and procedures for peaceful management of conflicts
- Providing support to African Governments in their efforts to fight against poverty
- Enhancing the mobilization of financial resources via tax systems reforms
- Promoting an effective financial administration
- Improving financial management and expenditure by increasing allocative efficiency and equity, and technical efficiency in the use of budgeted resources



WHAT WE PROPOSE TO DO

- ❑ **Provide Assistance in Human Resources Development, namely in:**
 - Improving leadership and management skills
 - Designing and delivering training through innovative methods
 - Increasing public service use of ICTs to monitor performance, promoting learning, improving service delivery, and increasing access to information by public servants and citizens
 - Providing instruments for implementation and monitoring

- ❑ **Information Sharing and Exchange of Experiences:**
 - Expand UNPAN to the national level
 - Information/experiences shared via UNPAN should be more closely linked to the implementation of the MDGs
 - Strengthen UNPAN in advisory service and online training

- ❑ **Coordinate Development Assistance in Public Administration:**
 - Expand the Governance Inventory to other regions
 - Revive and expand the UN Programme on Aid Management and Accountability
