WHAT HAS BEEN DONE

✓ **Exchange of Best Practices:**

- **UN Public Service Awards:** In 2008, the PSA will be presented at the UNHQ on 23 June. The sixtieth anniversary of the UN Programme in Public Administration and Finance will also be celebrated on this date.

Awards in three categories:

- 1) improving transparency, accountability and responsiveness in public service;
- 2) improving the delivery of services;
- 3) fostering participation in policymaking decisions through innovative mechanisms.

Six new products were developed to increase awareness about the PSA:

- 1) New UNPAN featuring all information related to the awards in 6 UN official languages
- 2) A new online database designed to facilitate online applications
- 3) Users' guidelines for the online Awards database
- 4) A follow-up questionnaire devised to gather past winners' experience
- 5) A new brochure on the Awards, and
- 6) UNPSA Newsletter

WHAT HAS BEEN DONE

WHAT DO WE PROPOSE TO DO in 2008-2009

Themes of the Multi-Year Agenda adopted by the Committee:

- 2007: Participatory governance and citizens' engagement in policy development, service delivery and budgeting
- 2008: Capacity-building for development, including post-conflict reconstruction of public administration and crisis/disaster management
- 2009: Building transparency, accountability and trust, including leadership development through information and communications technology (ICT) tools
- 2010: Governance, public administration and the UN Development agenda



WHAT DO WE PROPOSE TO DO in 2008-2009

New emerging priorities identified under the 2008 theme of “Building governance and public administration capacities for development” as per CPC’s recommendations:

- Developing standards of excellence in public administration education and training partnership with IASIA through enhancing the capacity of public administration schools and institutes to attune government and public service leaders to the challenges facing the world in various regions and countries
- Improving back office management to make government operations more transparent, accountable and trustworthy through the application of ICT tools
- Building capacity in participatory governance approaches, strategies for civil society engagement and tools for policy formulation and implementation
- Building transparency, accountability and trust in government in the context of the UN Development Agenda and the UN Convention against Corruption through work related to civil service reform, public sector ethics and public accountability
- Reconstruction of public administration capacities after crisis and/or conflicts

WHAT DO WE PROPOSE TO DO in 2008-2009

Reform Proposal

- **Resource requirements:**

DPADM: Initial appropriation: \$13, 287.6

Revised estimate: \$13,011 (change: \$-276.6)

Post change: -1

DESA: Initial: \$158, 384.3

Revised estimate: \$163,849.5 (change: \$5,464.7)

Post change: +33



WHAT DO WE PROPOSE TO DO in 2008-2009

Reform Proposal

- In order to respond more effectively to its mandates, it will be necessary to streamline and strengthen the delivery of DESA 's support and services to Member States. It is proposes to reorganize and reorient the work programme of DPADM as follows:
- (A) Strengthening promotion and support for greater and more creative use of ICT to enhance governance as well as development policymaking at the country level, together with strengthened substantive support for e-governance
- (B) Increase focus on the extended development of e-tools for more efficient and cost-effective delivery of DESA'a services, including in capacity development at the national level
- (C) Strengthening capacity development support for national development strategies, including by providing direct support to national ECOSOCs as multi-stakeholder mechanisms to formulate such strategies and review their implementation
- (D) Strengthening the analytical and research capacity of DPADM to better address governance challenges in post-conflict reconstruction, as well as reform processes for maintaining peace and preventing conflicts, through strengthening institutional and human capacities for maintaining peace and preventing conflicts;
- (E) Strengthening support to UNPAN to extend it to the sub-regional and national levels, and continued support to CEPA



WHAT DO WE PROPOSE TO DO in 2010-2011

Proposed strategic framework for the period 2010-2011:

- **Main objective:**

To promote effective, efficient, accountable, participatory and transparent public administration for the attainment of internationally agreed development goals, including those contained in the United Nations Declaration and in the outcomes of the major UN conferences.

- **Expected Accomplishments:**

A) Enhanced dialogue on improved understanding of the issues related to public administration, participatory governance, capacity-building and promotion of professionalism and ethics, knowledge management for development.

B) Enhanced knowledge and improved exchange of innovations and good practices in the area of public administration, participatory governance and knowledge management for development.

C) Increased capacity of national Governments to strengthen participatory governance, professionalism and accountability in the public sector for improved performance, including through the use of information and communications technology.



WHAT DO WE PROPOSE TO DO in 2010-2011

- **DPADM's strategy:**

It is based on an integrated approach comprising the provision of substantive support to the GA, the ECOSOC and the CEPA, analytical work, capacity development as well as the dissemination of best practices, experiences in information- sharing and network building

- **Expected Accomplishments:**

A) Promoting greater awareness, common approaches, understanding and innovative policy options among Member States in key areas of public management such as: *post conflict reconstruction of public administration; engaged governance; capacity-building and promotion of professionalism and ethics in the public sector; use of information and communications technology in government and resource management.*

B) Strengthening partnerships and cooperation with other international and regional as well as professional organizations within and outside the UN system to increase synergies among the related activities

C) Devoting special attention to countries emerging from conflict or crisis
