- Decentralisation of key functions e.g courts, Passports.







## **Localization Agenda**

governments?





- To translate policy frameworks programmes at the subnational level.
- To enhance capacity of local and regional government officials and stakeholders to integrate the 2030 Agenda and its SDGs into sub-national development plans/strategies and accelerate implementation.
- strengthening and maintaining the capabilities of LAs and societies to design and implement strategies that minimize the negative impacts of unprecedented and overlapping challenges e.g. COVID-19 pandemic, a cost-of-living crisis, and conflicts, climate change, pollution and biodiversity loss.

- ❖ We have started supporting Capacity Building of LAs and to date 6 VLRs have been
- produced. (Vic Falls, Harare, Bikita, Mutasa, Bulawayo, Zvishavane)
- Capacity building workshop for 12 LAs was done in October.










# Role of local government in SDG implementation
