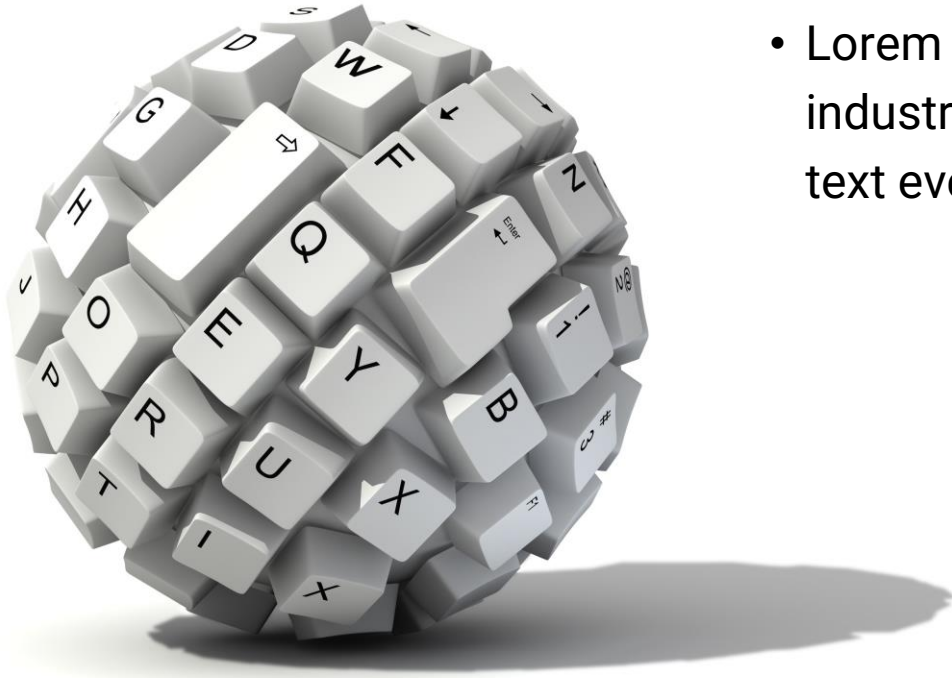

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## **1. What are two critical lessons learned in implementing data/digital transformation strategy in your country: what works and what doesn't?**

1. For Mongolia, it is very important for the metadata standards of the data to be unified when transferring and exchanging information between public organizations.
2. The second important thing is reliability of indicator data.





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## **2. What are two challenges that you face, and would like to learn from other countries?**

1. In addition to the SDG criteria, there is often observed that Mongolian civil servants are not reporting according to the indicators when making performance reports.
2. From the experience of other countries, how can we consistently use good quality indicators such a SDG indicators and make decisions at the policy level? We would like to learn how it is managed by the rules and regulations.





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### **3. Suggest one recommendation for further discussion in UN forums; how can the UN and the global community better support countries in advancing effective data/digital governance strategies?**

- The data frequency of indicator should be short. We believe that if we find indicator data in a short period of time, we can respond more quickly for solving the problems at decision-making policy level.
