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Background

B- Infrastructure is key to implementing data/digital transformation. Great progress with data centers, fibre optic implementation, key DPIs underway. Affordable internet, affordable devices, access to the power grid and data silos remain top priority areas of focus in Uganda.

A- Balancing the need to focus on the current initiatives such as infrastructure implementation, while keeping an eye on emerging and deep tech like A.I, Robotics and their ethical usage.
