Sierra Leone's Data Governance Landscape

Sector-Specific Data Systems: Managed across sectors like healthcare, education, agriculture, and finance. However, many of these systems are siloed, meaning there is limited cross-departmental integration.

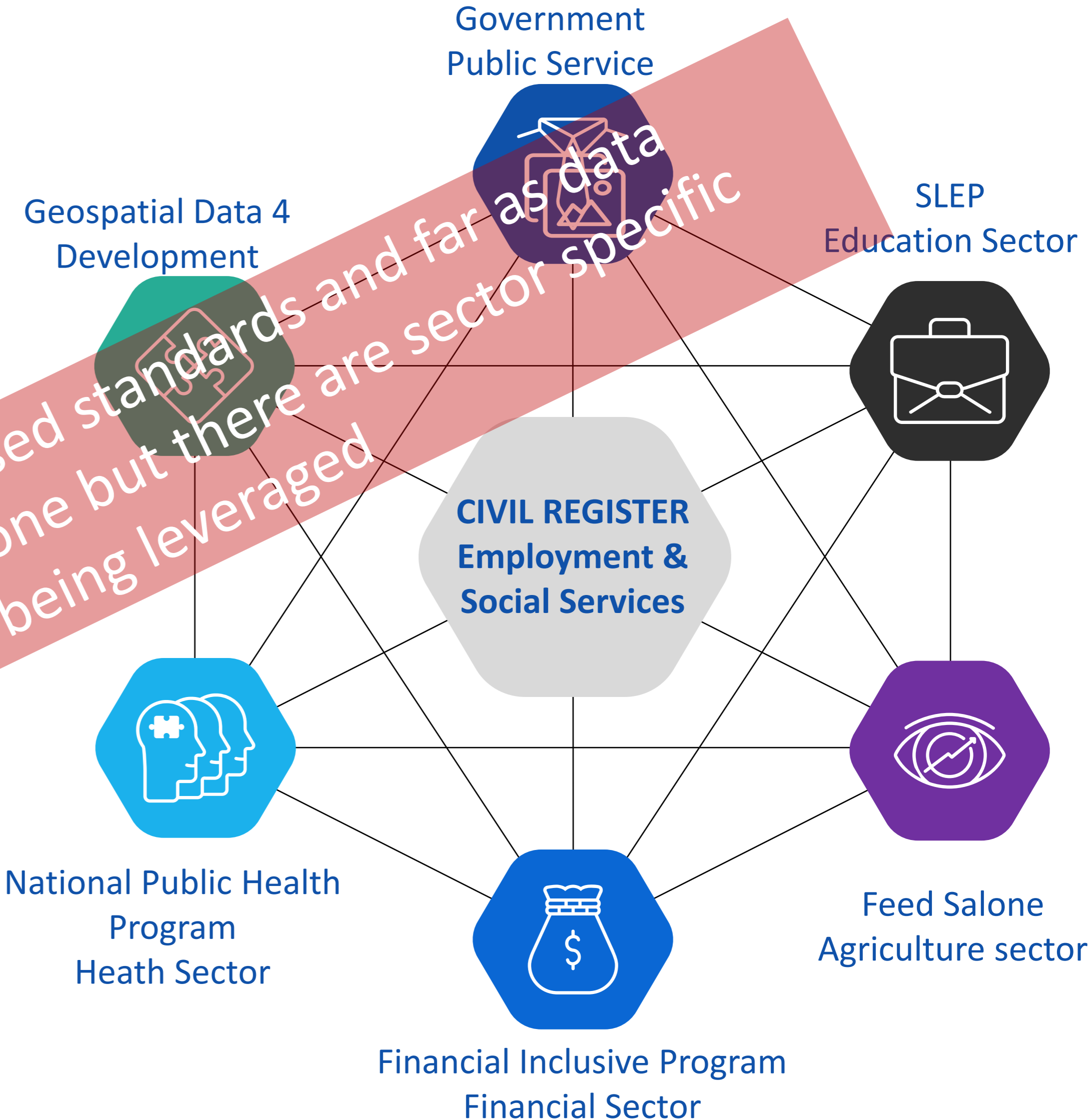
Open Data: Sierra Leone has an Open Data Portal, a positive step towards transparency, though the scope and quality of data available through this platform remain limited. It primarily hosts statistical data, and there's an ongoing effort to expand the types of datasets available for public use.

Geospatial and Statistical Data: Key agencies like Statistics Sierra Leone and the National Spatial Data Infrastructure (NSDI) are working on harmonizing data, especially in the context of population censuses, Telecoms infra, and land use.

National Civil Registration System: mandated to among others carry out the continuous, permanent and compulsory recording of the occurrences and characteristics of vital events including Births, Deaths and social status change

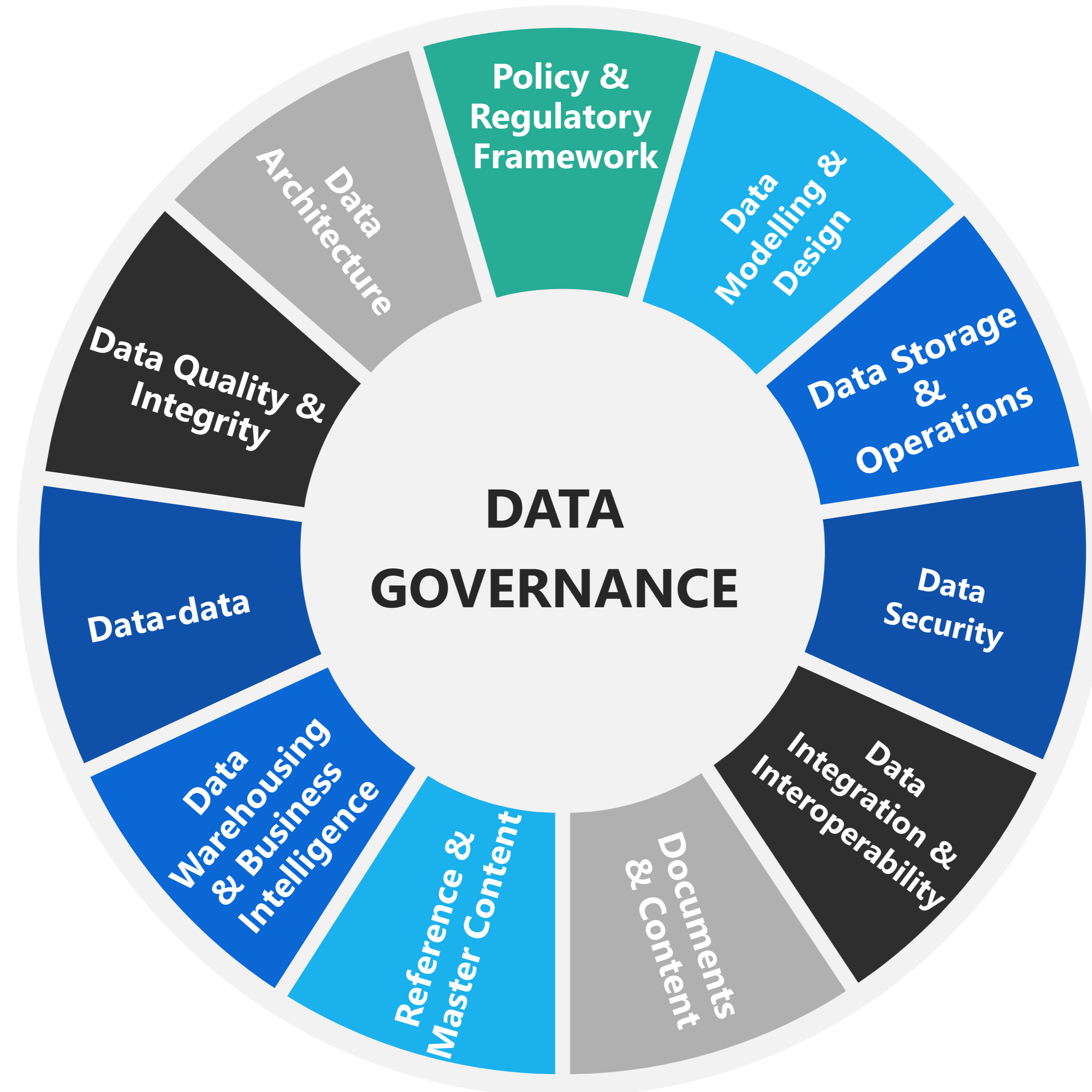

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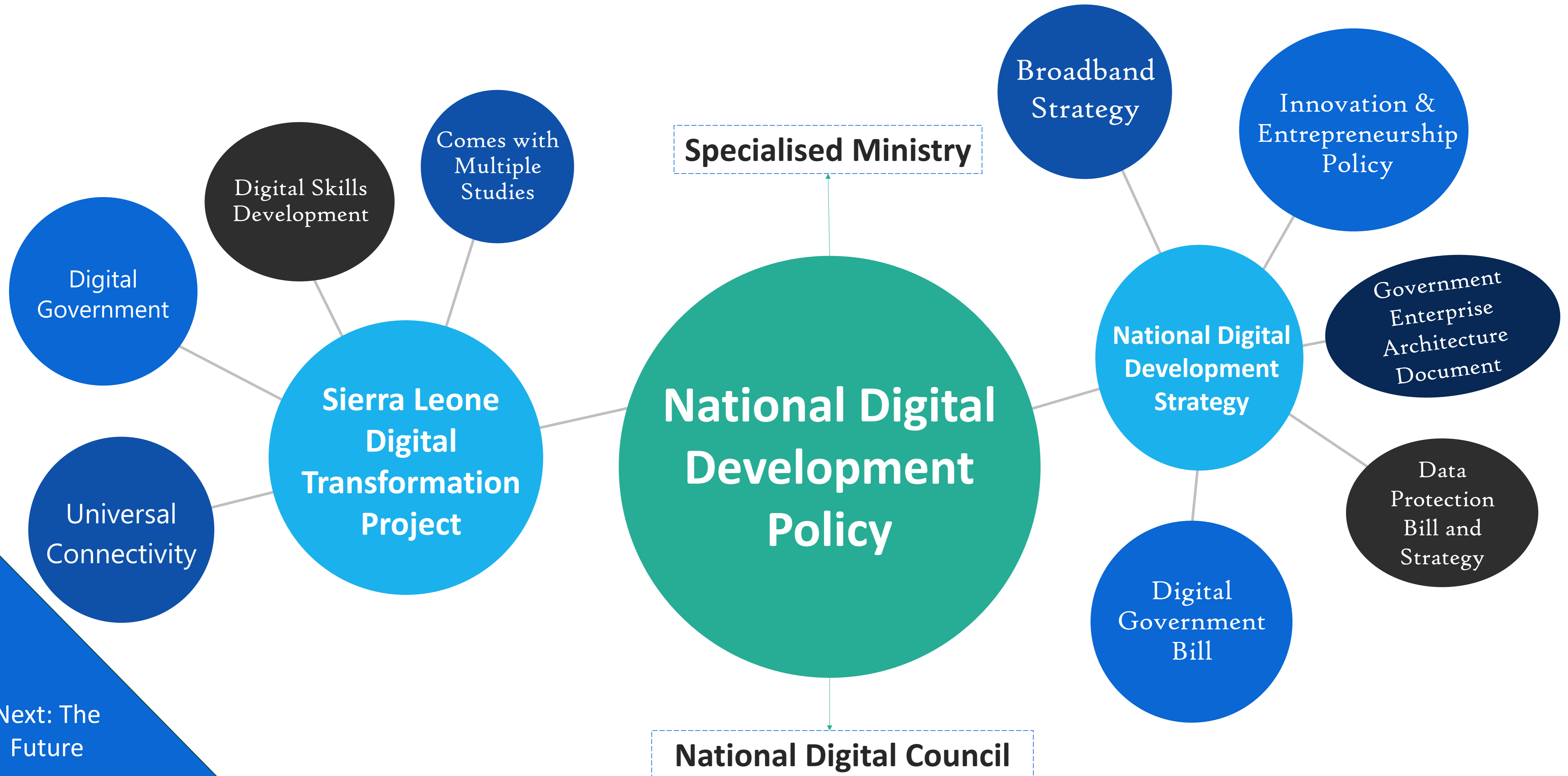
Resultant Effect of this Policy

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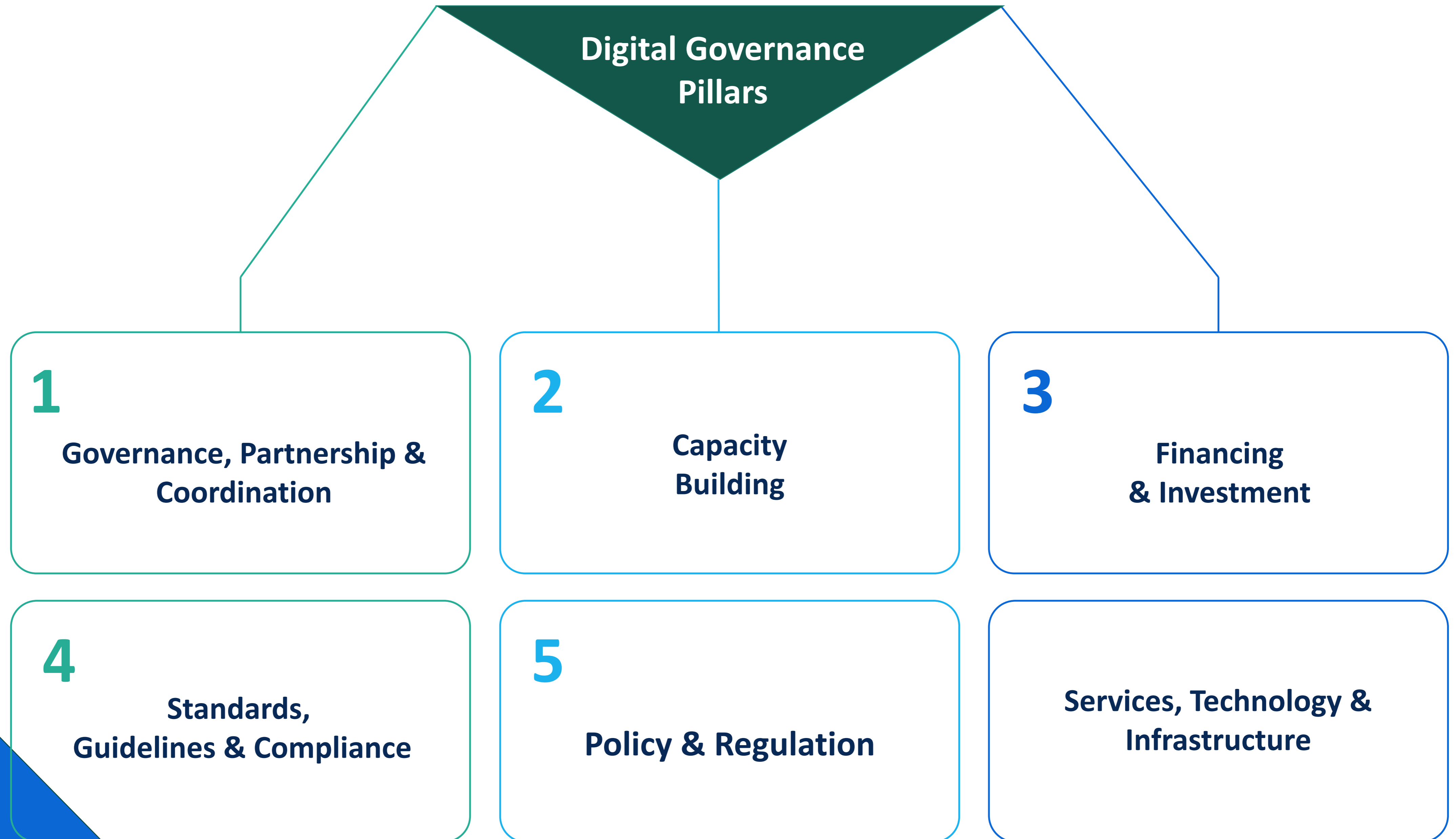
