## International strategic framework

Digital transformation Strategy 2030


- Promote development of innovation products that have commercial, social and economic relevance and are providing real added value for the African economy and contribute to social development

- Build a vibrant sector approach to digitalization of the agriculture, health and education sectors





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

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## A NEW STRATEGY STRENGTHENING THE DATA ECOSYSTEM

# **Diversify data source: E-Government**

### 1. Challenges

- Gabs in terms of content and applications development
- Slow progress in establishing a single digital market in West Africa
- Public services not widely accessible online across regional borders
- Unavailability of local government content and applications offering more value added

### 2. Actions outlined in the new strategy: Regional E-government strategy (ongoing)

- Creating a positive environment for content creation
- Establishing robust and inclusive Identity systems.
- Encouraging the connection of all governmental buildings to the national backbone, for deployment of and accessibility to e-services
- Establishing frameworks to facilitate access to services through eID
- Encouraging Member States to move from descriptive to interactive egovernment platform.
- Establishing a regional guide for IoT and AI implementation addressing training needs, infrastructure requirements, connectivity, and software.



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## A NEW STRATEGY STRENGTHENING THE DATA ECOSYSTEM

# **Diversify data source: E-Commerce**

### 1. Needs

- Deepener regional integration
- Use of technology to accelerate structural change and development

### 2. Actions outlined in the new strategy:

- Support the implementation of ECOWAS E-commerce strategy 2023-2027
  - Set guidelines and standards for electronic signature ensuring security, privacy, and interoperability
  - Set mechanism for electronic signature mutual recognition: regional trust system mechanism and supervision
  - Establishing a regional addressing policy.
- Support the implementation of African Continental Free Trade Aera (AfCFTA) in West Africa Region
  - Protocol on digital trade
  - Regulatory principle addressing personal data protection, Cross-border data transfers



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## A NEW STRATEGY STRENGTHENING THE DATA ECOSYSTEM

# **Diversify data source: Digital Identity**

- 1. Needs
  - Increase number of people with government-recognised proof of unique identity
  - Use a unique identity to access to services
  - Ensure trust and confidence with regards to the technological development
- 2. Actions outlined in the new strategy: Support West Africa Unique Identification for Regional Integration and Inclusion (WURI)
  - Facilitate access to services through eID
  - Create an ECOWAS Regulation on electronic identification and trust services
  - Encourage establishment of National Identity System Authorities across all member countries.



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### A NEW STRATEGY STRENGTHENING THE DATA ECOSYSTEM

# Improving storage facilities: Data centre infrastructure

### 1. Challenges

- Significant gap in accessing the required high-level standards in the region
- Insufficient government investment in datacentre infrastructures

### 2. Actions outlined in the new strategy

- Encourage Member States to establish resilient and redundant government data center infrastructure
- Encouraging investment through Public Private Partnership (PPPs)
- Support the creation of at least one virtual free of charge platform for content creators for each member states

# Promoting sustainable data governance to enhance the ecosystem of content and application

#### 1. Challenges

- Many risk, threats and weakness undermining digital development
- Failure of legal and regulatory frameworks to keep up the pace with the rapid digital development

#### 2. Actions outlined in the new strategy

- Evaluation of the state of data, its availability, implementing a data governance monitoring guiding Toolkit applicable in all countries
- Define the technical needs for achieving efficient data governance:
  - Data standards and classification
  - Data control (localization, sharing)
  - Data access (openness, quality, interoperability, exchange, portability)
  - Data processing
  - Data security, protection and privacy
- Establish a regional framework

# Policies and legal frameworks: Initiatives

- 2024: Revision of ECOWAS Supplementary Act A/SA.1/01/10 on Personal Data Protection
  - rapid developments in the digital era worldwide
  - needs to ensure the continued relevance of the Act in supporting ECOWAS countries in promoting effective data protection, especially when dealing with complex cross-border data flows.

 2025: Revision of the Directive C/DIR 1/08/11 on fighting cybercrime within ECOWAS

- enhance its relevance and effectiveness in combating emergent cybercrimes.
- ensure alignment with recent international norms and standards, maintaining the Directive's relevance and effectiveness

# Policies and legal frameworks: Initiatives

• 2024-2025 : Elaboration of an Open Data Normative act

### 1. Needs

- Approach for creating the data-driven regional society, promoting open data and the digitalization of public services
- Empower Member states governments to take a central role in using open data to create value

### 2. Challenges to address

- Evolution of ICTs, the impact of digital government that increase the volume of public data
- Issues of to data sovereignty, location, and flow
- Right of information and data protection
- Ambition of establishing a unified digital market for the ECOWAS region

# Policies and legal frameworks: Perspectives

- Revision of the ECOWAS Supplementary Act A/SA.2/01/10 on Electronic Transactions
- Develop a regional framework on e-signature for mutual recognition and trust policy
- Develop a community Act on eID and services accessibility within ECOWAS



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### **INITIATIVES/PERSPECTIVES ON DATA GOVERNANCE**

# Leadership and Governance: Perspectives

- Encourage establishment of National Data protection Authorities
- Support dialogue and cooperation on data governance
  - Data sharing: to reach a data sharing agreement in ECOWAS region formulated as legal and regulatory frameworks to support secure and compliant data sharing practices
  - Creation of the West African Data Protection Authorities Network (WADPAN)
