The United Nations Public Service Awards (UNPSA) is the most prestigious international recognition of excellence in public service. It was launched in 2003 after the UN General Assembly had, in 2002, designated the 23 June of every year, the United Nations Public Service Day to promote in the public service initiative, creativity, innovation and continuous performance improvement in the delivery of services. The United Nations Public Service Awards program is managed by the Division for Public Administration and Development Management (DPADM) of the United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs (UNDESA) in collaboration with the United Nations Entity for Gender Equality and the Empowerment of Women (UN-WOMEN).



## **Mandates and Milestones**


- 2003: Launch
- September 2015: GA reiterates mandate: Requests the Secretary-General to continue to provide assistance... including through .. the United Nations Public Service Awards ..., providing assistance in institution-building and improving the integration and coordination, as well as the innovation, of public sector initiatives and activities in sustainable development
- 2016: Award's review.

- Questionnaire to 8 organizations having awards




## Three components of the United Nations Public Service Awards Program (UNPSA)






#### Purpose and objectives of the UNPSA program







#### Categories of the UNPSA

- Improving the delivery of services
- Fostering participation in policy-making decisions through innovative mechanisms
- Promoting Whole-of-Government Approaches in the Information Age
- Promoting gender-responsive public service delivery



#### Relevance and usefulness of the UNPSA

- Enhances the awareness of the importance of public service to development
- Encourages and promotes creativity and innovation in the public service
- Assists in sharing experiences and information about service delivery
- Helps in learning about the delivery of public services in other countries
- Helps increase networking with other public servants
- Helps motivate public servants to work harder and better
- Helps make working in the Public Service more attractive for young recruits
