







EGDI components





- OSI Online Service Index
- TII Telecommunication Infrastructure Index
- HCI Human Capital Index
- the scope and quality of online services quantified as the Online Service Index (OSI);
- (ii) the status of the development of telecommunication infrastructure or the Telecommunication Infrastructure Index (TII); and
- (iii) the inherent human capital or the Human Capital Index (HCI). Each of these indices is a composite measure that can be extracted and analyzed independently.

$$EGDI = \frac{1}{3}(OSI_{normalized} + TII_{normalized} + HCI_{normalized})$$




EGDI components



- OSQ a list of 148 questions (2020)
- Positive answers generate "more in-depth questions" inside and across the patterns.
- The total number of points scored by each country is normalized to a range of 0 to 1.




