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Purposes




- Captures emerging issues, concerns & innovations in governance & public administration;

Main Elements:

- Competent, diverse & ethical public service
- Citizen engagement, e-participation & multichannel service delivery

- Administrative systems for responsiveness
- Public Service contextual sensitivity & ability to foster partnerships
- Institutional capacity for managing multi-sectored partnerships & multiple-stakeholder engagement
- E-government as part of transformative agenda

Main Elements:

- Safeguarding resources, fighting waste, mismanagement & corruption
- > Transparent & accountable institutions
- Shared & social accountability
- > E-government & open government data
