
Recent Mandates in 2013

ECOSOC Resolution E/RES/2013/23 requests the Secretariat to continue:

- ■To address gaps in research, monitoring, capacity development and implementation in governance and public administration, and to further develop its public administration country studies and to increase the scope and depth of its capacity-development activities;
- ■To promote transformative government and innovation in public governance so as to achieve sustainable development by further promoting advocacy and knowledge transfer on good governance through, inter alia, United Nations Public Service Day, the United Nations Public Service Awards and the United Nations Public Administration Network, by developing capacity-building tools and approaches, including self-assessment tools, and providing advisory services in the field, as appropriate;
- •To assist in the implementation of the Plan of Action adopted by the World Summit on the Information Society at its first phase, held in Geneva 2003, and the Tunis Agenda for the Information Society, adopted by the Summit at its second phase, held in Tunis 2005, on issues related to e-government, e-participation, mobile government, open government data, the use of information and communications technologies in parliaments and the Internet Governance Forum.

UN E-Government Survey

8th Edition: E-Government for the Future We Want

- ✓ DPADM publishes the UN e-Government Survey every two years. Started in 2001, the United Nations e-Government Survey became a flagship product of UNDESA representing the only global publication listing a comparative assessment of global e-government development in 193 countries, including indicators, strategies, tools and best practices
- ✓ Member States are ranked in accordance with the E-Government Development Index (EGDI), a weighted average of three normalized scores on: the availability of online services, telecommunication infrastructure and human capacity
- ✓ The data is used extensively and cited by renowned organizations, including the World Bank, the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD), the Economist Intelligence Unit (EIU), the European Union (EU), the World Economic Forum and the International Telecommunication Union (ITU)

- ✓ The de facto global network and portal for public administration and governance



- ✓ UNPAN is the second most visited site in DESA with total visits over 5.5 million in 2013
- ✓ English and Chinese versions of the E-Government Survey 2012 are among top 10 downloaded publications in DESA (Q4 2013)
- ✓ The Division utilizes other social media channels including YouTube, Facebook and Twitter

UN Project Office in Governance (UNPOG)

- ✓ Based in Seoul, it acts as an international and regional focal point for research, training, and advocacy in government reinvention
- ✓ Aims to promote participatory, transparent, and effective democratic governance in order to improve human development

Internet Governance Forum (IGF)

- ✓ The global multi-stakeholder platform for policy dialogue on Internet governance
- ✓ The 8th IGF was held from 22-25 October 2013 in Bali, Indonesia, on "Building Bridges - Enhancing Multistakeholder Cooperation for Growth and Sustainable Development"
- ✓ The 9th IGF will be held in Istanbul, Turkey on 2-5 September 2014



Priorities for 2014-2015

- Servicing of intergovernmental bodies
- ✓ The 13th Session of CEPA
- Strengthening institutional and human capacities of governance and public administration systems
- ✓ Will focus on 1) public sector institutional capacity development, and 2) public sector human resource capacity development including leadership, with emphasis on developing countries especially LDCs, Africa and countries emerging out of conflict
- ✓ Ensure mainstreaming management of diversity including gender
- ✓ Advisory services to Rwanda, Togo, Cameroon, Congo Brazzaville, South Sudan, Mexico, Haiti, Zambia, Ethiopia and other requesting Member States



Priorities for 2014-2015

E-government development

- ✓ Enhance the e-Government Knowledge Base; continue its work in strengthening institutional frameworks for e-government and e-leadership capacity for sustainable development, as well as in the area of innovation and e-governance
- ✓ Continue to support government in their efforts to promote collaborative governance and whole-of-government for sustainable development
- ✓ Continue to support DESA for the preparations of the PGA highlevel event on south-South, triangular cooperation and ICT for development to the Post-2015 Development Agenda



Priorities for 2014-2015

Citizen engagement in managing development

- ✓ Research and analysis on channels, modalities and tools for citizens engagement in managing development as part of the ongoing UN Public Administration Country Studies
- ✓ A tool called Measurement and Evaluation Tool for Engagement and e-Participation (METEP) will be developed for measuring and evaluating the use of ICTs in citizen engagement and public participation
- ✓ Multi-stakeholder engagement in internet governance and ICTs for development management



Strategic Framework for 2016-2017

The strategy to achieve the expected accomplishments, with particular attention to issues of innovative public administration and transformative governance in advancing sustainable development, is based on an integrated approach:

- ✓ Providing secretariat and substantive support to the GA and ECOSOC; as they relate to issues of public administration, governance and e-government in support of sustainable development
- ✓ Promoting greater awareness, common approaches, understanding and sustainable policy options among Governments through advocacy and knowledge transfer on good governance, particularly through the Committee of Experts on Public Administration and the United Nations Public Service Day and **Awards**
- ✓ Providing advisory services and capacity-building tools, based on research and analysis by the subprogramme, including through the United Nations Public Administration Country Studies, E-Government Surveys and the World Public Sector Reports
- ✓ Strengthening partnerships and cooperation with other international, regional and professional organizations, including through the United Nations Public Administration Network
