
## Some lessons learned

- 1. Access is a priority and needs to be meaningful
- 2. For those online, safety and freedom must be guaranteed
- 3. Transparency, participation and accountability are key for efficiency + justice
- 4. Environmental sustainability should be a concern from the beginning

1. Address digital exclusion with policies that seek meaningful access



- Digital divides are plural
- Produce disaggregated data to develop group-specific solutions
- Address both access and uses of the internet
- Look at measures to address both the supply and demand side of access
- Address underlying causes of digital exclusion



2. For those online, freedom and safety must be guaranteed




- Recognize that our experiences online are not the same

   Carry out gender and human rights impact assessments for digital policies
