





Why?


- boundaries because they are Many complex policy challenges transcend interrelated sectoral
- Government organization in sectoral ministries is less complex than real-world interdependencies of problems




Develop, plan and monitor policies in an integrated manner! Systems thinking to understand linkages

Systems Thinking

- To cope with complex (or: wicked) problems
 - Lack of a root-cause
 - Unpredictable
- To identify the interactions between different parts of a system
- Linkages, synergies, conflicts, trade-offs
 - Various techniques





Policy planning, making and monitoring

- Establish mechanisms to identify linkages, synergies, conflicts, trade-offs
 - Whole-of-government approaches, whole-of-society approaches
 - Reflect on institutions for coherence
